



# At Home Projects

Project 1

## Lemonade Stand

This week you'll plan to create and run a lemonade stand. Today, research what ingredients you'll need to make lemonade. Write out the recipe you'll follow.

You will plan out how much it will cost for you to run your stand. You can look online at Walmart's website, or look in newspaper grocery ads. Using your ingredients list from yesterday, calculate how much the ingredients will cost you.

Now you need to decide how much you'll charge for each cup of lemonade. Keep in mind how much it will cost you to make the lemonade in the first place. You want to make sure you make a profit!

Create a sign and slogan for your lemonade stand. This should get buyers' attention and persuade them to come to your lemonade stand and buy from you!

Design your lemonade stand. You can design it on paper or construct it at your house. Attach your sign that you made to it. Now, save it for the summer when you can run your lemonade stand!

Project 2

## Beach Day

This week you'll plan out the perfect beach day. First, you need to do some research and decide which beach you'll go to. Will you travel somewhere sunny? Do you live near a beach? Decide where you'll go and how you will get there.

It's time to plan out what you will do when you get there. What activities do you plan to do? Will any of them cost money? If so, estimate how much money you should bring to the beach.

You don't want to forget anything for this trip. Create a packing list to make sure you have everything you need.

Create a schedule of what your perfect beach day will look like. Include what time each activity will start and how long it will take. This way you'll be sure to fit in everything you want to do!

What a great day! Write a journal entry telling all about your beach day. Describe what the beach was like, what you did, and how you felt!

Project 3

## Zoo Trip

This week you'll plan out a trip to the closest zoo. Research the closest zoo to you and how long it will take you to get there. Decide what time you'll need to leave your house to get there right when they open!

Look at the zoo's website. What animals do they have at the zoo? Which animals do you plan on seeing when you go? Write a list of questions you would like to ask the zookeeper when you get there.

Create a schedule to follow on the day of your zoo trip. Include all of the exhibits you'd like to visit, any shows you'd like to see, and other activities the zoo offers. Include what time each activity will start and how long it will take.

What is one animal you wish the zoo had? Write a letter to the zookeeper telling them why that animal would be a great addition to the zoo.

Create your own map of the zoo. Make sure to include a key. If there is no photo of a map on the zoo's website, you get to create your own from scratch!

Project 4

## Ice Cream Truck

This week you'll get to design and run your own ice cream truck. Decide what ice creams and popsicles you'll sell in your truck. You have a \$25 budget. You can look online on a grocery store website.

Today you'll need to decide how much you'll charge for each type of ice cream. Keep in mind how much it cost you to buy them in the first place. You want to make sure you make a profit!

Design your ice cream truck today! Be creative – think of ways to get others to want to buy from your ice cream truck! Don't forget to include a business name on the side of the truck.

Find a friend or family member to do this part with you. Have them pretend to go shopping at your ice cream truck. Help them calculate prices of different combinations of ice cream and popsicles. Then, reverse roles and let THEM run the ice cream truck, and YOU be the customer!

The newspaper wants to run an article on your ice cream truck. Write a paragraph about why your ice cream truck is the BEST in the city. What makes it so unique and special?



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<b>Project 5</b>	<p><b>Plan a Vacation</b>          This week you'll plan your dream vacation! Today, decide where you will go and who you will go with. Why do you want to go there?</p>	<p>Before you can plan further, it's time to think about a budget. You have \$1,000 to spend on this vacation. Decide how much you will spend on traveling, a hotel stay, food, and activities while you are there. What are some ways you can save money on this trip?</p>	<p>It's time to plan out what you will do on your vacation! Will you be relaxing? Visiting new places? Create a day by day itinerary of your trip – meaning decide what you will do each day.</p>	<p>Look at a map to see how far your destination is. If you're able to, print a map out, and draw a line showing the travel route you'll take to get there. What states or countries will you cross through on your way?</p>	<p>You are having a great trip! Write a postcard home to a friend or family member. On the front, draw a picture of your favorite activity of the trip. On the back, write them a short message telling them all about your vacation!</p>
<b>Project 6</b>	<p><b>Run a Water Park</b>          This week you'll design and run your own water park! Today, decide on a name and slogan for your park. Design the logo that will go in the front of the park.</p>	<p>What rides will you have at your water park? Brainstorm a list of everything you'd like to include in your park. Make sure there is a variety of rides and activities for all ages.</p>	<p>Design a BRAND NEW ride for your water park. Draw a picture of it and write a paragraph explaining how it will work. Don't forget to give your new ride a creative and catchy name!</p>	<p>You can't forget about food stands in your park. Create a menu of the food items you will serve, and decide how much you will charge for each item.</p>	<p>Create a map of your new water park. Make sure to include a key. It should be neat and colorful - this will be the map park visitors will use when they visit your park!</p>
<b>Project 7</b>	<p><b>Pool Party</b>          This week you'll plan a pool party for all of your friends. Today, decide who you will invite and what food you will serve at the party. Make a list of both!</p>	<p>Before you can choose a date for the pool party, you need to check the weather. Research the weather for the next two weeks in your town. Choose a date for your pool party – why did you pick this day?</p>	<p>Create an invitation to send to your friends inviting them to the pool party. Let them know when and where the party is, and what food you'll serve. Make sure you persuade them to come – let them know why they won't want to miss your awesome pool party!</p>	<p>Design a new pool float for the party. You can be as creative as you want. Draw a picture of it and write a paragraph explaining how it will work. Don't forget to give your new float a creative name!</p>	<p>Create a new pool game for the party. Write out step by step instructions so you can teach your friends how to play the new game at the party!</p>
<b>Project 8</b>	<p><b>Family Campout</b>          This week you'll plan a family campout! Today, you'll need to look up some campsites nearby and choose one for your campout.</p>	<p>Plan what food you will eat during your campout. Decide what you'll have for breakfast, lunch, and dinner. Make a grocery list of what you'll need.</p>	<p>No one else in your family knows how to make s'mores! Write down step by step instructions on how to make s'mores so they know what to do at the family campout.</p>	<p>What activities will you do during your family campout? Will you go fishing, hiking, play board games, etc? Make a schedule of your day and what activities you'll do. Make sure to include what time you'll do them and how long they'll take.</p>	<p>Design your dream tent for the campout. You can design the outside with whatever you'd like, and even design the inside as well. Be creative – your tent can include anything you'd like!</p>
